- □ Students will be fully immersed in the global and local spaces and cultures of the UK & Ireland sport industry.
- ☐ Program travels to to cities (London, United Kingdom and Dublin, Ireland) over a three week period.
- ☐ Program fee includes accommodation, transportation, lectures, some meals, meetings, activities, and events.
- ☐ Students will be be given the opportunity for first hand experience in, and a thorough understand of, the rapidly expanding global sport marketplace through:
  - Formal lectures delivered by prominent guest scholars from UK and Ireland universities in the field of sport management
  - Meetings with sport managers and executives from governing bodies, corporate sponsors, sport media corporations, major venues, and professional teams to outline the UK and Ireland sport industries.
  - Site visits to locally and nationally prominent European sport stadiums, venues, and facilities.
  - Attend a Gaelic hurling match, the 2019 Cricket World Cup, and the 2019 FIFA Women's World Cup in France.
  - Physical cultural experiences such as Gaelic football and hurling, whitewater rafting, footgolf, and Olympic road cycling.
